#### Adam Gilmour | CEO, Gilmour Space Technologies

Very few bankers transform their careers the way Adam Gilmour has. He is the CEO and Founder of Gilmour Space Technologies, a Gold Coast based private space company whose goal is to provide low-cost access to space, and to enable human spaceflight and exploration. Prior to realising his "space dream", Adam spent 20 years at Citibank where he worked in Foreign Exchange sales and trading businesses. In his last role he managed the Regional derivatives sales and structuring business, based in Singapore, with a team of over 250 headcount.



#### Emma Petherick | Partner, McKinsey & Company

Emma is a Partner in McKinsey's Australian Public Sector Practice, and leads the Queensland practice. With a background in Economic Development, she has been with McKinsey & Company for 12 years, and focuses on large performance transformations and driving innovation in the public sector and community setting. She has worked on these types of transformations in Australia, the US and the UK, focusing on the role of leadership, culture, system design and incentives in underpinning transformation success.

Emma has Bachelor Degrees from the University of Queensland in Economics and Law (Hons; University Medal) and a Masters of Economics (Hons) from Oxford University. Outside of McKinsey she has worked in management roles in both the corporate and non-profit sector, and she is a Director on the board of the Catherine Freeman Foundation.



#### Dale Dickson PSM | Chief Executive Officer, City of Gold Coast

Dale joined the City of Gold Coast in 1999 and was appointed Chief Executive Officer in July 2003.

The City of Gold Coast is the second largest local government in Australia with an annual budget of \$1.5 billion, over 3,400 employees and serves a resident population of around 575,000 and 13 million annual visitors.

More than three decades of local government experience, including roles with Melbourne and Brisbane City Councils, Whitsunday Regional Council and Gympie Regional Council have given Dale a unique perspective on the challenges and rewards of working in local government.

Dale holds a Bachelor of Business in Local Government, a Graduate Diploma of Management and a Master of Public Policy and Management.

In 2014 Dale was recognised in the Australia Day honours list with a Public Service Medal for 'outstanding public service to local government'. This award added to previous awards including the Governance Professional of the Year Award from the Chartered Secretaries of Australia and Queensland's top award for leadership in local government by the Local Government Managers Association.
