Ratio and Comparative Analysis is a one day workshop that encourages decision making for financial sustainability, value-for-money outcomes based on a thorough understanding of financial risk, reporting and governance. Comparative and ratio analysis will be used to identify the historical drivers of financial performance and to identify opportunities to improve performance.

This workshop combines class discussions with practical exercises, giving you the opportunity to apply techniques you learn in a real-life context. The material is presented in an easy-to-understand manner and contextualised for the public sector.

WHO IS THIS WORKSHOP RECOMMENDED FOR?

The workshop is designed for decision makers and staff who are responsible for interpreting and using financial reporting for better, financial risk management and/or project evaluation. It is presumed that participants will have some prior experience at using and interpreting financial statements, however, the workshop will start with a recap on how to read financial statements. Participants with some existing knowledge can use the workshop to refresh or extend their knowledge.

WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

At the completion of the workshop, participants will be able to understand:

- How the information contained in the financial statements can be analysed and interpreted to assess the drivers of financial performance and enable informed decision making
- Tools and techniques used to measure, summarise and assess financial performance
- Financial ratio benchmarking and how to examine the liquidity, operating efficiency, capital structure suitability, profitability, and sustainability of an entity
- The limitations of financial ratios
- The development of financial policies

- Recap of how to understand financial statements
- Overview of the financial governance framework and financial policy development
- Analysing financial statements using horizontal, vertical and financial ratio techniques
- In-depth view of liquidity, profitability debt/capital structure and management efficiency financial ratios
- Understanding the limitations of financial ratio analysis
- The interrelationship between financial statements, good financial decisions and prudent and efficient asset management

PRACTICAL EXERCISES

Working individually or in small teams, participants will apply knowledge and techniques covered in the workshop to successfully understand and interpret an organisations' financial statements. Participants will use ratio analysis to identify the historical drivers of financial performance and identify opportunities to improve financial performance going forward. Financial ratio formulae will be provided. Participants will also learn how to calculate the components necessary for financial ratio analysis themselves.
